WHAT IS A CARDIAC CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST (CNSp) ?

Our Lady's Childrens Hospital, is the National Centre for Paediatric Cardiology and Cardiothoracic Surgery in Ireland. The Cardiac Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNSp), is a member of the Cardiac Team, who has specialist knowledge in cardiac conditions. There are a total of six Cardiac CNSp's, and patient caseload is divided into two main groups, caring for children and young people with biventricular and univentricular heart conditions. The Consultant Cardiologist, will allocate you if appropriate to the CNSp service.

What is the role of the CNSp?

The role of the CNSP includes:

- Provision of practical information, education and emotional support to parents following ante-natal or post-natal diagnoses of cardiac disease.
- Assessment of the social, cultural, spiritual, psychological, emotional and physical needs of children, young people and their families.
- Provision of support and advice during the transition between home, community and hospital cardiac care

How can you contact your CNSp?

You can telephone the hospital 01-409 6100 and ask them to bleep your CNSp. There is a CNSp available 5 days a week, on the bleep systems between: 9:00am – 5:00pm

How do I change my child's appointment?

You should contact your Consultant's secretary to change same. .

Who do I contact for a medical letter to support medical card applications, or letters for school, etc.? All applications and forms for health and/or social welfare benefits must be brought to *your own GP to be completed*.

The cardiac service can provide letters of support, if required by the relevant government bodies. If you require such letters, *please phone your Consultants secretary*.

What if my prescription runs out?

Always ask when at clinic for a new prescription. Contact the Consultant's secretary at other times
