What if my child is unwell?

You may find it difficult not to worry every time your child is unwell. This is perfectly normal.

In the first few weeks after your child's treatment finishes and while they still have a hickman line/port inserted, you will need to bring your child to hospital if they spike a temperature or have any signs of infection as the line will need to be cultured.

However, once their blood counts are back to normal and the line has been removed, you can take them to see your GP, if you have any concerns.
