Welcome to Surgical Day Unit (SDU)

This is a busy 12 bedded unit where staff are committed to providing quality day care for children in a safe environment. We hope you enjoy your clinical placement with us.

On the SDU, we care for infants and children who require surgical treatment. These children often have underlying medical conditions also. It would be advisable to review these conditions prior to or at the start of your placement.

These include the following:

Gastroenterology

Endoscopy - OGD & Colonoscopy

Dermatology

Laser treatment – mainly for Port Wine Stain/Birthmarks

Orthopaedics

Congenital Dislocated Hips, Scoliosis, Application of Body casts, limb lengthening procedures, ORIF

Ophthalmology

Squint repair, Examination under Anaesthesia, Blocked tear ducts

Dental

Restorations and extractions, EUA

General Surgery

Circumcision, Orchidopexy, Hernia repair, Cystoscopy, Insertion/Removal of JJ stent, Broviac removal

Plastic surgery

Suturing of Lacerations, Otoplasty, Nail bed repair

Hours of Placement (All Students)

You will be advised on how many days & weeks you must attend placement for (clinical shifts and reflective practice days) by the following:

- Supernumerary & Rostered Nursing students: Student Allocations Liaison Officer (SALO)
- PRCNS students: PRCNS Co-Ordinator

Off Duty

- Your off duty will be decided by the Clinical Nurse Manager 2.
- Changes to your off duty may be facilitated but this is dependent on ward skill mix.
- Duty may be swapped between students only with prior agreement of Clinical Nurse Manager 2.
- During your placement you will be allocated a preceptor and a co-preceptor. We try as much as possible to
 facilitate students to work alongside your allocated preceptor so that your assessments are performed by
 nursing staff you have been closely linked with.
- ➤ Reflective practice: You will be facilitated to attend your mandatory reflective practice sessions in the CCNE (Children's Centre for Nurse Education) or online. Reading & unstructured reflective practice will be accommodated but must be undertaken within the department.

Clinical Learning and Student Support:

The Surgical Day Unit aims to provide a quality learning environment. A wide variety of learning resources and supports are available. You will be allocated a preceptor for your clinical placement. Nursing students have opportunities to work with all the staff nurses and the Clinical Nurse Facilitator but your meetings will be facilitated by your individual preceptor. You will receive an orientation to the unit on your first day and the unit routines will be explained. If you experience any problems during your placement, please ask any nursing staff member, who will help you and aim to offer support at all times.

The SDU learning outcomes are available from your preceptor. There are several education folders in the unit that will also provide information about the children in our care. If you have any specific learning needs, please discuss these with your preceptor, Clinical Nurse Facilitator or Clinical Placement Coordinator. If appropriate, you may contact the unit or your CPC in advance to discuss any concerns. Changing facilities are available and you will have access to a locker for the duration of your placement. Finally, enjoy your placement in the SDU and be assured we are all available to help and support you throughout your placement.
