

### Transfer to another hospital

When your baby is close to discharge home, your baby may be transferred to another hospital that is closer to home, this helps facilitate transition from hospital to home and also provides a local link into the team in your local hospital.

### Equipment and Supplies

We will help arrange any equipment and supplies your baby may need at home. Your Public Health Nurse will be contacted and updated on your baby's condition and may help with certain equipment and supplies.

### Discharge Home

Prior to discharge your baby's follow up appointments will be arranged, some of these may be in CHI Crumlin and also your local hospital.

Your GP will be sent a letter with an update of your baby's admission to hospital.

Jenny, Elaine and Karen work as part of the Neonatal CNSp team and have specialist knowledge of sick new-born babies, including premature babies.

### What we do

We understand that having a baby in hospital can be a difficult times for parent and families, and during your baby's admission we will provide support, information, education and communication.

- We are the link person between you and your primary Neonatal Consultant and the various members of the multidisciplinary team that may be involved in your baby's care.
- We provide practical information, education and emotional support to parents in relation to your baby's illness.
- We provide support and advice during the transition from Maternity setting to Crumlin Hospital and also in the transition from Intensive care to the ward to home and finally into the community.
- Some of the areas we can help with are, milk expression and breastfeeding, explaining a baby's treatment in detail, organising multi-disciplinary team meetings with families and the medical teams and discharge planning home into the community.

### The CHI at Crumlin Team

A Neonatologist is a Consultant who specialises in the diagnosis and treatment of sick neonates.

Our Neonatal Consultants work between Crumlin and Temple Street Hospital, and also in their Maternity Hospital. The Neonatologists will do weekly rotations in Crumlin. Your baby will have a primary Neonatologist allocated to them.
